Since 1995, this will be the second time in the history of the Academy to hold its annual meeting on the UAPB campus. We are excited to share our campus with you on this occasion.

Conference activities will take place in the STEM Building Conference Center (1530 L. A. Prexy Davis Drive) and the H. O. Clemmons Arena. Information For Presenters

Abstract submissions are now open for the 2023 AAS meeting. Abstracts must be submitted online via the conference website by Feb. 27th for both oral and poster presentations. Further technology instructions for oral presentations will be sent to presenters in March. The presentation rooms will be accessible prior to each session for speakers to prepare for their talk. Oral presentations are scheduled in 15-minute increments. Please plan on a 12-minute talk followed by 3 minutes of questions. All oral presentations will begin at the scheduled time.

For optimal display, posters should be limited to 36 inches high x 48 inches wide. Poster sessions for all disciplines will be 9:00-11:00 AM Saturday morning with setup time 7:30-8:30 AM. Posters will be displayed in the STEM Building Conference Center 1st Floor. Displaying supplies will be provided.

JAAS Publication

Manuscripts based on a presentation given at the meeting may be submitted to the *Journal of the Arkansas Academy of Science* for publication in Volume 77. Please ensure that manuscripts are submitted to the Journal website (https://scholarworks.uark.edu/jaas/) by the new due date, **April 30, 2023**. Manuscripts submitted after this date will likely be held over for consideration in Volume 78 in 2024. Manuscripts not based on a

presentation at the annual AAS meetings will not be considered for review.

Authors must follow instructions for prospective authors found on the Academy website (http://www.ArkansasAcademyofScience.org) under the Journal tab. Authors that fail to follow these instructions may be asked to revise their manuscript to bring it in line with instructions before it goes out for review. The Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR)/Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) program – a resource to develop and implement impactful research.

The SBIR/STTR program awards \$4B annually to small businesses and their partners to conduct research and development work that brings new and needed products and services from idea stage all the way to commercial-readiness level. The program encourages participation by all people, including women, people of color, people with disabilities, and entrepreneurs located in all 50 states and U.S. territories. This program grows sustainable companies and high-tech jobs across the nation.

Rebecca Todd serves as the grant writer for BioVentures, LLC. BioVentures is the technology commercialization arm of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS). Todd assists the BioVentures executive team in all facets of creating competitive extramural funding proposals. She identifies opportunities and works with the executive team to craft applications and create reports for post-award monitoring. Todd assists in completing writing, editing, research, submission, and reporting tasks for written documents ranging from grant proposals, manuscripts, abstracts, presentations, nominations, biographies, profiles, and other assignments that support UAMS/BioVentures grant applications. Todd has 14 years of experience with helping innovative small businesses explore and respond to federal funding opportunities in the Small Business Innovation Research/Small Business Technology Transfer (SBIR/STTR) program. In her previous role as innovation specialist with the Arkansas Small Business and Technology Development Center, she assisted research-based companies across the state with winning 91 SBIR/STTR awards totaling more than \$37 million dollars.

Journal of the Arkansas Academy of Science (JAAS):

Manuscripts for publication in *JAAS*, based on a presentation given at the meeting, will be due **April 30, 2023**. At least one of the authors must be a member of AAS.

Manuscripts must be submitted to the JOURNAL website: http://scholarworks.uark.edu/jaas/. Authors and co-authors who have submitted manuscripts via the system previously, should use the contact/email and password that they used previously. New authors should follow instructions on the site to establish their profile. Authors can subsequently update their profile with any changes to their contact and account info as necessary. Should you have any problems, please contact the Editor-in-Chief (jarksci@gmail.com)

Comments for Prospective Authors

Authors are required to use the instructions found on the AAS website in preparing manuscripts submitted for publication in the JOURNAL. Authors are directly responsible for the major formatting of their article and, thus, manuscripts must be properly formatted PRIOR to submission. Of particular importance is proper setting of margins, line and paragraph spacing. Figures and tables must be inserted into their appropriate locations in the manuscript. A caption should be written under each figure and above each table. The editor and printer do no significant retyping or editing and only act to assemble the Journal. The electronic copy of the manuscript (word document, not pdf) should be a single file. To view and/or download new instructions visit the Academy website. Please note that after successful review the final product submitted by the authors will be the published document in the Journal.

All manuscripts must be submitted electronically via the JOURNAL website: http://scholarworks.uark.edu/jaas/ with the entire review and publication procedure being handled via the server. Please allow time to get use to the new system if you have not used it before. E-mailed manuscripts will no longer be accepted.

To avoid rejection at Editorial review, PLEASE read the instructions for prospective authors found on the Academy website: http://www.arkansasacademyofscience.org/aasjournal.html (Journal tab). The instructions and policies can also be

accessed by following the links from the Journal web site.

Awards competition for student presentations at the AAS Meeting: Students

commonly present results of their research at the annual meetings of the Arkansas Academy of Science. Our award competition seeks to recognize outstanding presentations made by these students. Categories for oral presentation awards include Life Science and Physical Science, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels of competition. Certificates and cash awards may be given for first place (\$100), second place (\$50), and third place (\$50). Awards for the best overall undergraduate and graduate poster presentations will also be made.

Student presenters interested in any of these competitions should indicate their desire to compete on their submitted abstract. Presentations and posters not specifically entered into the competition will not be judged, nor will they be eligible for an award.
